

# UConn Landscape Architecture

## Letter of Intent

The UConn Landscape Architecture Program is a selective program and has a cap of eighteen students (maximum) per grade level beginning with the spring semester LAND 2410 (LA Design 1) & 2120 (LA Graphics II) curriculum.

Anyone who has taken LAND 2110 (LA Graphics I) or LAND 2210E (LA Theory I) or is taking it this fall is eligible to be considered as a landscape architecture major.

The minimum requirements for continuation in the Program of Landscape Architecture are a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or better and a grade of 3.0 (B) or better in both introductory courses. For students meeting these requirements, faculty will evaluate:

1. A portfolio of work produced in introductory courses (or during other relevant experiences), for graphic competency, consistency, and academic growth.
2. A 250-word essay detailing understanding of and commitment to the discipline of landscape architecture.
3. Overall past academic performance (GPA)

to determine final acceptance into the Program.

**This form, your portfolio, and your written essay must be submitted at the final project review for LAND 2110 on Friday December 9, 2022.**

The LA Faculty will review these materials, and students will be notified of their acceptance into the program and given permission to enroll in the subsequent landscape architecture courses
