CLUB HISTORY

Founded in 1882 and located just outside of Boston, Massachusetts, The Country Club is one of the oldest private clubs in the United States and one of five charter members that founded the United States Golf Association. The Club offers 27 holes of championship golf, dining and event facilities, a fitness center, swimming, racquet sports, skeet shooting, curling, cross country skiing, ice skating and more. TCC has played host to 17 USGA national championships and it has served as the site for several of the game's most important events. These include the 1913 U.S. Open, won by amateur and Brookline-native Francis Ouimet; the 1999 Ryder Cup; 1902 U.S. Women's Amateur, the Club's first national championship; and four U.S. Opens (1913, 1963, 1988, 2022). The Country Club will be hosting four future USGA Championships, the 2030 U.S. Girls' Junior Amateur, the 2034 U.S. Men's Amateur, the 2038 Men's U.S. Open and the 2045 Women's U.S. Open.

DESCRIPTION

The candidate must be a team player with a drive, passion, and positive attitude. Assistant Superintendents report directly to the Senior Assistants, Golf Course Superintendent and Director of Grounds.

Assistants are expected to help lead and manage all aspects of a large-scale grounds operation including mowing of greens, tees, fairways and roughs, bunker and hazard maintenance, tree care, aerification, divot filling, daily golf course setup, hand watering, equipment setup, shop maintenance, golf course construction projects and all other tasks involved in the daily upkeep of a private championship golf course.

Assistant Superintendents will be cross trained in all facets of golf course maintenance and operations, including in-house construction projects. Assistants will work with the leadership team to maintain a culture that results in successful, career-oriented, professionals. This is a tremendous opportunity for those striving to grow personally and professionally in the turf industry.
